If you have made a decision to end your pregnancy, this pamphlet provides answers to commonly asked questions and basic information about what to expect.



What kind of abortion care is available for me?

Planned Parenthood of Orange and San Bernardino Counties offers two options: the abortion pill and surgical abortion, which is performed at a medical center. When you call to schedule your abortion, a trained medical staff member will perform an over-the-phone health evaluation to determine the safest care for you, depending on the stage of your pregnancy and your personal preference.

Abortion Pill

An abortion pill may be offered to women in the early weeks of pregnancy who do not have health problems.

Medication to interrupt the pregnancy will be provided to you at the clinic, and a second medication will be given to take at home. You will experience cramping and bleeding.

Although the abortion pill is effective 97% of the time, it is important that you follow up with us afterward to ensure that the abortion was complete.

In-Clinic Surgical Abortion

We also provide in-clinic surgical abortions. You will come into the medical center for approximately half a day for this service. Patients are eligible for in-clinic surgical abortions during the first and second trimesters of their pregnancy. Anesthesia will be offered, depending on the type of procedure you undergo.

How Effective Are These Methods of Abortion?

You can feel confident knowing that both of these methods are very safe and effective.

Will it hurt?

Pain depends on the individual and the type of procedure. When you visit the medical center for abortion care, a trained health care provider will discuss what to expect during the abortion and afterward. If you are going to have medication to help you relax or sleep through the procedure, both verbal and written instructions will be provided.

Who will perform the abortion?

The State of California requires that an abortion be performed by a medical doctor. If you decide to select the abortion pill, it will be administered by a certified nurse practitioner or physician's assistant.

Is abortion safe?

Yes, abortion is very safe. However, some risk is associated with any medical procedure, including abortion. The doctor and clinical staff that care for you will make sure that you understand the possible related risks prior to any procedure.

What if I'm still not sure?

Planned Parenthood understands that the decision to have an abortion is complex and deeply personal. Our health care professionals are available to answer medical questions, and can also provide referrals to agencies that provide information on prenatal care, adoption, and parenting, as well as professional and spiritual guidance.

How Much Does It Cost?

Our fees are on a sliding scale. We accept Medi-Cal and insurance (please check with your insurance company about authorization requirements before your visit). If you are uninsured, you may qualify for a state-funded program or a lower-fee scale.
